HOW TO FILE AN AMENDED FEDERAL RETURN

For Nonresident Alien Individuals

When you need to amend a tax return for a nonresident alien taxpayer, take the following steps.

- 1. Download the appropriate Form 1040-X
 - a. For 2019 and later tax returns
 - b. For 2018 and earlier tax returns
- 2. If desired, you can download the instructions for Form 1040X
 - a. For 2019 and later tax returns
 - b. For 2018 and earlier tax returns
- 3. Complete the form as follows
 - a. Enter the taxpayer's name, current address, and social security number (SSN) or individual taxpayer identification number (ITIN) on the front of Form 1040-X.
 - b. DO NOT enter any other information on page 1.
 - c. Also, DO NOT complete Parts I or II on page 2 of Form 1040-X.
 - d. Enter in Part III the reason why you are filing Form 1040-X.
- 4. BEFORE YOU MAKE ANY CHANGES TO THE RETURN IN TAXSLAYER, print a copy of the taxpayer's original return, as it was filed.
- 5. Create a new tax return or make corrections to the taxpayer's existing return, as appropriate.
 - a. If the taxpayer filed in our system as a Nonresident and needs to file as a Resident or viceversa, you must change his/her social security number in Taxslayer to something fake, such as 123-45-6789. Taxslayer will not allow you to start a new return if there is an existing return with the same social security number.
 - b. Let Leanne know the fake social security number and that the return needs to be deactivated.
- 6. Attach
 - a. 1040X from item 3 above,
 - b. Amended return with "AS AMENDED" written on top of each page, and
 - c. a copy of the original form submitted with "COPY OF ORIGINALLY SUBMITTED" on top of each page.
- 7. Provide the client with instructions regarding how to submit these documents to the address provided in the IRS 1040X instructions.
 - a. Search "Where to File" in the instructions and make sure the address you provide is appropriate to the taxpayer's circumstances.
- 8. Provide a copy to the taxpayer for their records.
